There are over 1,200 TKE alumni living within a 125 mile radius of Bowling Green in addition to a core of 14,600 Tekes in the states of Ohio and Michigan combined.

Founded in 1956

Tau Kappa Epsilon was founded at Bowling Green State by a group of World War II veterans whom were members of a local fraternity at the time called Delta-Epsilon.

The choice to affiliate with TKE was born out of a need for an organization that provided something "different". They felt that men should be selected for

their own worth; for what they were and not for mere extraneous factors. So in the spring of 1956 this local group became a colony later chartering in 1958. Thereby becoming the Zeta-Lambda Chapter of Tau Kappa Epsilon, the 155th chapter in the TKE Nation.
