Edward C. Droste is the Co-Founder and partner of Hooters Restaurants which originated in Clearwater, Florida in 1983. Hooters currently has over 380 units open nationwide (the United States) with sales of more than \$700 million annually and consistently ranks as one of the nations fastest growing chains.

Over 9,500 men are currently enrolled as undergraduates at colleges and universities across the United States and Canada.

There are over 450 TKE alumni living within a 100 mile radius of Boise, ID area. In addition to a core of 2,030 Tekes in the states of Idaho and Oregon combined.

Founded in 1969

Tau Kappa Epsilon was founded at Boise State by a group of men whom were founded in 1949 as the first local fraternity on campus called Pi Sigma Sigma. Their motto was "pep, spirit, and service."

The choice to affiliate with TKE was born out of a need to attach themselves with an international organization that provided something

"different" and embodied what their own membership had already prescribed. They felt men should be selected based on their worth and character, rather than their wealth or other factors.

In the spring of 1969 this local group became a colony, later chartering in 1970, becoming the Nu-Eta Chapter of Tau Kappa Epsilon (the 295th chapter in the TKE Nation).
