Founded in 1954

Over 9,500 men are currently enrolled as undergraduate members of TKE at colleges and universities across the U.S. and Canada.

There are over 154 TKE alumni living in Northern Arizona, in addition to a core of 1,910 Tekes in the entire state of Arizona.

Tau Kappa Epsilon was founded at Arizona State College (now known as NAU) by a group of students who were members of a local fraternity at the time called Tau Kappa Theta.

The choice to affiliate with TKE was born out of a need for an organization that provided something "different". They felt that men should be selected for

their own worth; for what they were and not for mere extraneous factors. So in the spring of 1954 this local group became a colony later chartering in 1956. Thereby becoming the Epsilon-Rho Chapter of Tau Kappa Epsilon, the 113th chapter in the TKE Nation.
