TKE EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Explanation of Program

Every year the TKE Educational Foundation distributes tens of thousands of dollars in awards to our members in good standing to recognize their academic achievement and to assist in meeting the financial costs of higher education.

Any Teke, whether undergraduate or a member pursuing a graduate course of study, is eligible as long as they are a member in good standing within a local chapter. A member in good standing means someone who has remained current in all fees and dues payable to the Grand Chapter and has been involved in their local chapter.

The criteria for being awarded a scholarship from the TKE Educational Foundation vary from one fund to another. Each applicant should note the established criteria when applying.

The TKE Educational Foundation Board of Directors approves an annual award from each fund, as long as a fund is at or above \$5,000 as of the end of the Foundation's fiscal year (May 31), so an award can be presented in the following academic year. For donors who are working on building their scholarship funds, and have not yet reached \$5,000, whatever dollars are contained in the scholarship funds are maintained and invested for growth.

There are three general types of scholarships: Grand Chapter Scholarships, Regional or Area Based Scholarships, and Chapter Scholarships.

Grand Chapter Scholarships

These scholarships are available to all members and have been created for a variety of purposes, including "in memory of another member," "in honor of the service of another member," or to award achievement. Among these scholarship funds, the top four awards presented by the Foundation are the Ronald Reagan Leadership Award, Charles R. Walgreen, Jr. Leadership Award, Charles R. Walgreen, Jr. Scholarship Award, and John A. Courson Top Scholar Award.

- The Ronald Reagan Leadership Award honors the memory of the only Teke to have ever been elected president of the United States of America.
- The Walgreen Leadership Fund was created through a contribution from the late Charles R. Walgreen, Jr., grandson of the founder of the Walgreen Pharmacies and a top donor to the TKE Educational Foundation. Charles R. Walgreen, Jr. was also honored when TKE named its annual leadership academy the Charles R. Walgreen, Jr. TKE Leadership Academy.
- The Walgreen Scholarship was also established by the late Charles R. Walgreen, Jr., successful businessman and distinguished Teke.
- John A. Courson is one of a very few Tekes who have served as Grand Prytanis and TEF Board Chairman during their years of membership. Frater Courson chose to focus on academic achievement as the top criterion for his award.

Regional or Area Based Scholarships

These funds have been established by members of Tau Kappa Epsilon who are in a specific region and who have chosen to focus on encouraging the scholarship of the chapters within their regions. Some have been created by area alumni associations, and others have been created by individual alums in a specific region.

Chapter Scholarships

These are funds that are managed for a specific chapter. Each chapter is encouraged to promote their fund so alumni know it is there to encourage academic excellence and to interest those who might want to affiliate with Tau Kappa Epsilon. There is no limit to the size of a chapter scholarship fund and based on the Foundation's experience, the quality and longevity of a chapter often relates to its ability to provide scholarships to its members.
